

## Kathy's Corner



This is a hand that was played at the club recently. North is the dealer and opened 1 club. East can do nothing but pass and South will probably pass. What should West do? Double is probably best as they have quite a good hand and can support both Major suits. At our Table West bid 2 Diamonds, showing a good intermediate hand with 6+ diamonds. Either way, having passed over 1 club, 3NT is the best place to be.

If West doubled, East should not leave 1 club in for penalties because of the vulnerability on the hand. N/S are not vulnerable while E/W are. The score for 3 off not vulnerable is 500 and the score for 3NT making is 600. East cannot be certain of taking North 4 off so should bid the almost certain 3NT game.

When I played this hand, I was South (West opted to bid 2D) and at the end of the hand, East asked what they should have done. Obviously, there were many Easts who felt they had the same problem.

East's hand looks quite good for 3NT when partner shows 11-15 points and 6 diamonds. They have the King of diamonds which suggests 6 tricks in diamonds, a double stop in clubs and the king of hearts. Partner can only have 7 points in diamonds at the most so they must have something in hearts or spades. There is no clever way to bid 3NT here. Just bid it and hope.
